## The Editor's Sandbox - LiPo battery safety

More hobbyists every day are converting from good ol' internal combustion power to electric battery power. Most of us are used to handling batteries all our lives and take their safety for granted. However the chemistry necessary to produce batteries that supply the huge amp/hours that we need in powered models, introduces some unfamiliar dangers that require special knowledge and handling, and cannot safely be ignored. Without proper considerations, the power they store can be rapidly released in the form of fire, smoke, and heat that can be life changing faster than it can be controlled. Even I, your *brilliant* editor, and an electronics guy from way back, am not fully educated in the proper use and handling of modern power packs and their associated circuitry. So with that being said, I received permission from Fred Cronenwett of the Lafayette Esquadriille Control Line Club, Buder Park, St Louis, Mo. for permission to reprint his article in their newsletter.

So read on.

Here is what Fred wrote to help keep his club's members aware of LiPo safety.

- Check out Greg Gimlicks article in **Model Aviation (July 2015)** on Lipo battery packs, very helpful.
- The Lipo Batteries that we fly with are great in terms of the power they have and how much they weigh. If the batteries are not handled correctly the result can be nasty fire.
- Be Gentle with the balance wires, the wire can break as shown below.
- My charger has a setting called "Storage", This takes the battery down to the correct voltage when you are not using them.
- Do not short circuit the battery when fully charged, or any time.
- Do not store the batteries fully charged.
- Follow manufacturer's instructions for charging and discharging rates.
- Store the batteries in a fire proof case with a latch.
- Never use a pack that has visible damage, dents or cracks.
- Charge the batteries in a fire proof safe or something similar.
- Do not charge the batteries with your car's hood open. While it is possible to use your car battery to power the charger, if there is a problem with the battery the fire will consume the battery, charger and your car.
- If the battery is puffed up, stop using it and follow the instructions so that you dispose of it safely.

Fred goes on to illustrate his safe storage and charging methods:  
This is how I store and charge LiPo batteries. Click on any thumbnail picture to see a large image.

These are 3S batteries, the 1100 Mah is on top and the 3000 Mah on the bottom of the photo



All of my batteries are stored in this case with the latch shut when they are not being used. I take this case or another smaller case to the flying field



Foam liner this case allows for quick access to the batteries at the field or at home



These are 2S batteries, the smaller 800 Mah is used with a RC park flyer while the 5000 Mah is used on



You can tell the voltage of the battery by the number of wires, this is 3S battery with one ground and three colored wires



Batteries are charged in this fire proof safe, notice the slot for the wire so that the lid can be shut and locked



This can be repaired, but I am not going to attempt it. There is a circuit board below the plastic cover and the wire needs to be re-soldered to the board




