

March 22, 2016 Meeting Minutes



President Larry Lewis called the meeting to order at 6:32 PM on March 22, 2016 in the Forks Restaurant in Wake Forest. All club officers were present except Safety Officer Herbby Alford. Welcoming remarks were made, visitors introduced, and a meeting agenda was presented. There were 25 members and 4 visitors present. The 25 members included 1 member who joined at the meeting. The new member is Ray Litchfield.

Treasurer's report: Clyde Long reported that the club had \$19,682.25 in our account. All bills have been paid for the month of February and most of March.

Safety Officers Report: Herbby Alford has resigned as our Safety Officer. President Larry Lewis stated that there were no safety issues last month. He then appointed Clark McKeever to fill out Herbby's term and Clark accepted.

Secretary's Report: Marshall Sanderson reported that as of this date there were 115 paid members including 11 Associates, 6 Family and 4 Students. A motion to accept the minutes as published in the newsletter was made and seconded and the motion passed. Marshall reported that the AMA Charter fee and property owner's insurance were paid.

March 22, 2016 Meeting minutes

IT Communications Officer's Report: Steve Ballard reported nothing new.

Field Marshal's Report: John Keisler reported that roof repairs has not been done but should be done in the next few days or so. The flight stations need to be repaired and painted or replaced and parking fences on the south end should be moved for better parking. Runway cracks need attention and John is going to try something new with them and then schedule a work party. Dave Hockenberry has repaired 10 flight stands or tables with 3 more to do. John suggested that additional flight stands and tables be constructed for the south end.

Old Business: As a result of John's report and suggestion a motion was made by Mark Lofgren and seconded by Dave Langridge to remove the fences near the charging stations on the south end and use them as part of the flight stations repair/upgrade. The motion passed. A second motion was made by John Keisler and seconded by Don King to build three flight stands and three tables as a cost of approximately \$90.00 each. The motion passed.

Larry Lewis talked about the upcoming electric meet and that he has contacted Horizon Hobbies and they have given us a really great deal on prizes. Raffle ticket prices were discussed and set at \$5 each with discounts as more are purchased. Sam Zeoli, Don King, Skip Rollin and others are going to handle the food concession for the event.

Last old business was the vote on the By-Laws changes required to match actions taken at the February meeting. The changes are listed in red are as follows:

Section VI. Item 5- Associate; Must be a member of another AMA chartered club. This is non-flying, non-voting membership. (Note: Change to take place immediately for any new Associate members and January 2017 for any new or membership renewals.)

Section VII. Item 3- Members who are late paying their dues must still pay the entire yearly dues amount plus a \$10.00 \$50.00 late fee. (Note: Change to take effect in January 2017.)

Item 4. e. Associate Membership -\$50.00 \$10.00, for current members of another AMA chartered club. (Note: Change to take place immediately.)

All changes were passed and become part of our By-Laws.

New Business:

There being no new business a motion to adjourn was made and passed. The meeting adjourned at 7:35 PM.

After the meeting was adjourned Steve Sager gave a show and tell about his new large electric Kaos 90. Looks like a great project. Mark Lofgren brought his new Valley View RC engine, a 40cc twin, for everyone to see. Workmanship is outstanding.

Don't Mess With Don Kiryluk's



Sweet Sue



I have always heard of a Master builder but never new one till I saw some of the planes that Don has turned out. The Corsair last month was awesome and he told me months ago that he was building this P-38 lighting. I knew after seeing the Corsair that the P-38 Lighting was going to be a site to see and I was right.



Sweet Sue's Wing Span is 8', Length 48" and ready to fly at 22 pounds. She's powered by 2 1600 watt out runners run by 5 cell liPos and turning 16x10 3 bladed props with one a pusher. Motors controlled by a 100 amp speed controller on each. Of course the Gear is on air retracts. On board radio has dual receivers, one in in each side.

He scratch built it from old plans by (uncle willie). Standard balsa and ply construction sheeted with 5/32 balsa and covered with one layer of light fiberglass. He molded the cowls and many of the smaller pieces also from fiberglass.

The Plane has not be flown yet, He says he's waiting for the right weather, I hope I'm there!




