



A stroll down memory lane visiting Pete Soule's archives. There was a time when FAI Team Race models actually looked like an airplane. Wing, body, tail, beautiful finish and even forward visibility for the pilot. Karlis Plocins (Latvia) raced this model back in the day. One suggestion for slowing down current models would be to use models like this but built 1.5x to 2x the size. To encourage good looking models, the choice of pit segment might be given to the person with the best appearing model.



Here's the profile view of the model. If any of you use Vorobiev or Yugov engines you have Karl to thank for helping arrange the purchase of the first batch of these engines way back at the European Championships in Poland in 1991.



Peter Lott from South Africa added a solid wing to his Perky and top speed went from 101mph in 2014 to 106mph this year. Al Ferraro's beautiful entry honoring his former pilot, John Ross, thundered to victory with a 111mph proto speed. Peter's model uses a Nova Rossi 15 with mini pipe for power. Al chose the Fora 15 for power, much lighter than the Nova Rossi and along with a super light airframe it has superior acceleration. Perky models fly on 52 foot lines and are timed from launch for 16 laps.

Perky and Clown Speed at the 2015 Brodak Fly-In Report by Paul Smith

Speed went well in its first year with a full set of awards in Perky and Clown. Thirteen people accounted for 10 Perky entries and 7 Clown event entries.

All the contestants liked the format. We had late flying on Tuesday after the rain and an exciting *Happy Hour* Wednesday evening. Last minute flying resulted in both Perky and Clown standings being disrupted in the closing minutes.

Samantha Hines came out of nowhere and knocked everyone but Naomi down a notch.

Likewise, Al Ferraro finally brought out his new machine and did a *never-before-seen* 111.8mph knocking Peter Lott's 106.5mph off the top step of the podium. Those who stuck around heard and saw history at the Brodak Fly-In.

THE BRODAK FLY-IN 1400 LAP SUPER SLOW RAT RACE

Report by Paul Smith

One race was run because of rain delays. The winning team averaged 66.6mph for the race distance, second was 64.6mph and third 64.5mph. Light rain at times, no incidents!

The 1400 lap (100 mile) race has been run in Toronto for ten years. The only engine that can be used is the OS LA 25 and must be used in unmodified form running on suction. The choice of prop is limited to the Master Air Screw 8x6 and everyone uses the same supplied fuel, Ritch's Brew 10% nitro. Models are typical Super Slow Rats, 300 inch wing (one inch thick) and 24 inch body.

Mechanics are allowed to have their engines running at the start of the race but there are 20 required pitstops after that. Spare airplanes, engines, props, etc. are allowed, whatever it takes to finish the race. Event organizers predicted a winning time around one hour and thirty minutes. Lenny Bourel and Brad LaPointe finished just 8 seconds over that mark. Hallas/Whitney lost second place by 7 seconds!

Bobby and Andy had been at a F2d meet in Kansas the previous weekend. The “cheapie .28 car engine” in stock and modified form as discussed on the Delphi Speed Forum. Early tests are in the 160-180mph range but no official times yet. They’re still working the bugs out of the engine/tank setup. About the same weight as a F2A or A-Speed, much easier on the pilot.



Howard Doering's two Proto models (story to follow). John Newton with his .28 car engine project. How many of the current competition models has John built over the years? Lots of them!

Howard related the story about the "proto from hell". The red 21 Proto started life as a Magic Miler. On its maiden flight the model came in at Howard, missed him by six feet and smacked the pylon breaking it into several pieces. Torque, circular airflow from the prop wash, inverted engine, vertical tail on top, too nose up just sitting there and not enough tip weight. *Is that all? Ed.* The model was rebuilt and lessons learned incorporated into the blue model. Neither show a tendency to chase the pilot anymore.

Both NASS Sport Jet and Northwest Sport Jet were flown at the Whittier meet. The same airplanes but with different lines. NASS rules require .022 x 60 foot lines and timing is for 7 laps. Northwest Sport Jet uses .020 x 65 foot lines and is timed for 6 laps. Rotation speed of course is slower on the longer lines plus there's a little less pull. The Northwest rules seem to be clear and simple and preferred by the contestants over the NASS rules which they term "murky".

- FAI Code of Ethics
- Anti-doping : As per rule B.3.7 of FAI Sporting Code Section 4 Aeromodelling, Volume ABR 2015 Edition, any competitor who has to take any of the substances on the WADA Prohibited List for a medical condition must have a Therapeutic Use Exemption (TUE) granted by the FAI.

Valid FAI sporting licenses will be mandatory for each competitor, team manager, assistant team manager and mechanics. Only licenses which are registered on the FAI central database are valid.


