I was browsing RC Groups recently and came across yet another thread about someone with a prop-related injury. While this person's injury thankfully wasn't life-threatening, it was quite serious and required a trip to the ER. He admittedly performed one of the cardinal sins of electric: reaching through the prop while the power system was armed. The throttle stick on the transmitter was accidentally bumped and the motor came to life, which resulted in deep cuts that required stitches to close.

I mention this yet again because I see club members doing this very thing quite often. Please remember that if the battery is plugged in – regardless of whether the plane is turned on or not – it is a live system. It has the potential to come to life at any time, which could result in serious injury or worse. Never reach through the prop to carry your airplane unless the battery is unplugged. Never put your hands or fingers near a motor or prop that is armed – regardless of the size or cell count. This is common-sense stuff guys.

On a related note, <u>Airplanes should never be armed under the</u>
<u>shelter</u>. This continues to be an issue for some reason. Everyone under the shelter is exposed to the potential for injury if an armed airplane suddenly comes to life.
