Huntersville Contest

We have two of the three contests completed. Huntersville's Carolina Classic was well attended, with the largest stunt events being the Advanced and Profile classes. Carrier and Combat attendance was about normal for the spring contest, and these two events have proven to have the most spectator appeal. At any time, the fence was busy with onlookers watching with amazement at what these types of models can do. We continue to grow the May contest, but it still does not challenge the October contest for number of entrants.

Joe Nall was a very busy week, and the much anticipated threshold of our 2000th student pilot was reached on mid day Thursday. To commemorate the occasion, Mark Weiss presented the winner with a Plaque at Thursday's Center Stage Noon show. After the award was presented, Mark was told to hang around for a minute. Then, during the Joe Nall Perpetual award presentation, Mark's name was called as the 2016 recipient! This is a highly coveted award and it could not have been given to a more deserving individual for his hard work in promoting control line.

After the training flights were over on Thursday, we switched gears to contest prep, setting up the pits for Friday morning. Thursday ended with one of the worst storms I have ever seen at Joe Nall. The sky suddenly turned black around 6 pm, then the winds picked up and a lot of EZ Up tents that had been left up were damaged. But then it was over about as fast as it happened, and we were off to dinner to get ready for the nightly light show of RC models flying in the dark with multi-colored lights and strobes lighting up the sky. One big model of a Telemaster had such bright lights on it that it lit up the ground as it flew over. The contest went well with very nice weather both days, and I hope that we have a report on both contest in time for the newsletter.


Remember, if you fly electric models the field now has a permanent 12 volt power supply to keep your batteries charged up. All you need is a park pass and key to have access to the charging station.
