We have had lot of flying and fun, field improvements and We start 2016 with a new 5 year lease on our field. Let's make 2016 an even better year for RDRC.

RDRC CLUB MINUTES for November 17, 2015

(To be approved in Jan. 2016 meeting)

President Larry Lewis called the meeting to order at 6:30 PM on November 17, 2015 in the Forks Restaurant in Wake Forest. All club officers were present except Rodney Earp and John Keisler. Welcoming remarks were made and a meeting agenda was presented. There were 21 members and 1 visitor present.

Treasurer's report: Clyde Long reported that the club had \$ in our account. All bills have been paid for the month of November, including the 2016 lease payment. An adjustment to the budget is necessary to account for the increase in the lease rate going from \$ to \$ per year.

Safety Officers Report: Herbby Alford reported that Joe Adrignola's finger is doing OK. There was a near mid-air at the field recently and Herbby asked Joe Horvath to talk about it. The near mid-air happened while Joe was 3D hovering over the grass and another plane made a low pass and missed Joe's plane by just a few inches. After some discussion as to how to minimize the chance of this happening the general consensus was to have a spotter while flying and try to be aware of other planes flying. During our Fly-For-Tots and other events we indicate a spotter will be used and that seems to work very well. While it is not mandatory at our field for general flying, in our Flight Rules item 10 says "Use a spotter during times of heavy flying traffic".

Secretary's Report: Marshall Sanderson reported that as of this date there were 140 paid members. As of the meeting tonight there have been 26 membership renewals. Mention was made about the Christmas Party and several members indicated they would be attending.

(To be approved in Jan. 2015 meeting)

As of tonight there are about 25 who are planning to attend. A motion to accept the October minutes as posted in the Newsletter was made by Don King and seconded by Skip Rollin. Motion passed.

IT Communications Officer's Report: Steve Ballard reported that he has the camera for the shelter area but has not installed it yet, but will soon.

Field Marshal's Report: No report.

Old Business: Talked about how well the sod project went and many Kudos to Kerry Hawkings for his leadership on the project. There was discussion about possible catch cans for overflow during fueling so as not to kill the grass. Maybe adding signs to remind people to be careful during fueling.

Larry Lewis reminded everyone about the Christmas party on December 18th at the Fargo Steakhouse in Zebulon. A motion was made by Dave Langridge and seconded by Dave Thornberry to spend \$100.00 for prizes for the Party. Motion passed.

Larry Lewis gave a report on a meeting he and Marshall Sanderson had with our landowner, Calvin Brodie. He has no plans for the property. Our lease rate increased from \$1500.00 to \$2000.00 per year. This rate will be for the 5 year terms of the lease. The lease has been signed and paid for.

After a brief discussion the motion to accept the revised By-Laws was made by Dave Hockenberry and seconded by Dave Langridge. The motion passed.

New Business: Ed Radiel and others mentioned that the fences near the charging stations are causing parking problems. After some discussion the issue will be discussed further, probably in the January meeting.

The club officers for the next year were unopposed and a motion was made by Dave Hockenberry and seconded by Clark McKeever to vote on the officers. Motion passed and the current officers will serve until the next election, which will be in June 2016.

Larry Lewis reported that the Indoor Fly-In has been cancelled due to an increase in rent for the facility that has been used in the past. This is a popular event and hopefully another venue can be found. Anyone with any suggestions of another facility please get in touch with Dave Hedrick.

A New Year's Day club event was discussed. Hot dogs will be provided. There will be no formal flying events due to lack of any volunteers to organize them.

A motion was made to adjourn by Dave Hockenberry and seconded by Don King. Motion passed, and the meeting adjourned at 8:00 PM.

Safety Coordinator And Swapmeet Master

Rules, rules rules. They are everywhere. Most people, including myself, don't like a lot of excessive rules. When rules are enforced we tend to push our actions or responses right up to the limit of what the rule was trying to avoid. (With me it is that 55 MPH speed limit).

When it comes to general flying at our field, we are restricted in what we do by AMA and RDRC rules. The AMA safety code is a simple one page document of required rules for all AMA chartered clubs. If you have time, go to

their site and read it. It will not take long because there is not a lot there, just the basics. The AMA also has documents for flying site safety, operation and site specifications. These documents are not mandatory but are recommendations that each club can pull from to set up their individual field rules.

As safety officer I get questioned about the rules every time I am at the field. Usually I have to speak to someone or get a report or two about a previous infraction. 95% of the time it is just two of the rules that are in question. It is either a flight line violation or taxing in the pits. If you could help with those two things that would be helpful.

At our last meeting we had a spirited discussion on how to avoid midair collisions. At RDRC we have a very diverse group pf flyers. On any given day you can see warbird, 3-D, electric, helicopter, sailplane, sport, jet, and even FPV pilots vying for the same space. This makes our field a very exciting place. With that excitement comes the responsibility of being safe. So how do we manage all those different flying styles in the air at once? It all comes back to those pesky rules. The use of a spotter during high traffic or varying flying styles was highly recommended at the meeting.

Enough about rules, rules, rules.

Let's go fly and be safe doing so.

Well the Decathlon DA 150 trouble story gets deeper! After being told it's a carburetor problem and needed cleaning out, and yes it needed cleaning out, but the problem still existed! I added a fuel filter to keep junk out of the carb. Thinking that I could have a Ignition problem I switched out the module with a 3W I had laying

around it still would run at a idle but as soon as I give it any throttle it would die just like before! While talking to Josh Bunn about all this, he said that I should check the reeds, If they're cracked or broken they will cause some weird things to happen. So I again pulled the carb off and checked the reed cage to find a big piece missing from one of the reeds. Only one was broke and the others look fine, all 4 still tight against the cage, but I assume this hole is the problem for sure.

This sets right in the middle of the crankcase and I was afraid that this piece might have gotten in between the piston and cylinder so I pulled the jugs off to check for any scoring but found none

thank goodness. William and I looked with flashlights for any pieces that may be loose and found some very, very small pieces but nothing large enough to cause any damage. The engine was very clean with very little carbon, given how many hours this engine had on it, we're talking in the 100s + hrs. The rings and groves were clean of carbon with no signs of sticking. Bearings, from what I can see of them looked good and had no rust, pits or discoloration so I didn't feel any need to explore any more. Last we took a can of WD-40 and rinsed out every



inch of the Jugs, piston and crankcase before re-installing the jugs. With the Carb and the reed cage off anything in there would drain out the 2"x 2" hole in the bottom of the crankcase.



In the past DA has not offered parts like these to the public but does now. They still will suggest you send the motor in to them to have service like this done. The cylinder jugs are held on by 4 aluminum bolts that DA suggests to replace when removing the Jugs and the ones they sent to replace them was steel. They are only \$2 each so why not, the reeds all shipped and a can of WD-40 from Lowes I have \$28 in the repair. It does run now and started much easier, we'll see just how well my repairs hold up. FYI - I'm happy to say the SN is 4212 not 666


Josh Bunn gets the trouble shooting award of the month!




<u>RC Airplane Rocket stuff</u>

Had a great time working with the Boy Scouts Troop 24 on their Space exploration merit badge on December 5. One part of their badge was to build and fly a model rocket and learn what allows it to fly. We talked about center of pressure, CG, chute and streamer recovery and engine thrust. This was the first time working the Boy Scouts on this badge and it was enjoyable for me



hearing them wanting to learn more about the physics of rocket flight. Most of the time as with the Cub Scouts (The younger ones) they just want to fly all the time and don't want to listen to you talk more than about 30 second.



They built some small 1/2As for their badge and brought some larger ones that they had previously built. We flew 15 1/2A3-3T, 10 A10-3T, 13 B6-4 and 8 C6-5. They did all the packing and engine prep work for launch and did a great job. They recovered all but one that got blown into a tree but we put the largest engine we could in it

and knew we were lowering the chances of get it back, but had no melted chutes or streamers. I would love to get this group out to the field to do some RC flying at sometime.

BTW, from the Cub Scout group that comes out in August to fly with us at RDRC, 4 are now flying park flyers with their Dads and 3 have built Rockets outside of Scout activities and 2 are doing both. I'm sure more would if the parents would be more involved but they're not. This is why it's so important for us as a club to be involved with these Scout groups and youth in our community. Many are setting in front of video games now and don't make it outside and won't if we don't give them the opportunity.

Monster Pitts Python (85%) flown at Wings & Wheels 2013. Engine loses power and ends the routine early but brought down safely with limited power. This model is the largest radio controlled aircraft in the UK, maybe in Europe, weighing in at 138 Kg, just under the maximum limit as defined by the CAA of 150Kg. The Pitts is scratch built, that means plans, design, construction and materials are all created by the builder to emulate the full size aircraft and it took Greg 5 years to complete this 7/8th scale biplane. The engine is manufactured by Hirth and is usually mounted in man carrying micro light aircraft. 650 cc flat twin with a 63 inch 3 blade propeller.

All the description for this was in German I think. But here's the video. The size of this thing is unreal! This thing has to be 75 or 80%


