FLY FOR TOTS BABY!!!!!!!!



It's right around the corner folks, and it's looking to be another great one. We already have the big Grand Prize Plane under construction and it's a doozie. Horizon Hobby has again hooked us up with an awesome plane. Not only that, but they supplied the motor and exhaust system as well. This year's grand prize will be the new P3 Revolution Biplane, powered by a 62cc Evolution gas engine. They also provided the wrap around pitts muffler designed to quieten that beast of a motor. Anderson RC is providing the DX9 and receiver to guide this beauty of a plane, and Hanger 18 in Cary is supplying all the high end servos to move those big control surfaces. Tru-Turn will furnish the nose art to cap off the business end with one of their P-51 style spinners. Still plenty more to get all the details finished but we already have a commitment from Josh Bunn at Quality Automotive and Jacqui Sacks to supply all the inners to get this plane in the air. Blast Boards!

I need to ask a favor of all of our Jet Jockeys in RDRC. We have spent lots of time and money trying to get our grass looking good at RDRC and Dave Hockenberry has pulled off yet another act of kindness! He built two really nice blast boards and has donated them to RDRC. He even

provided the stakes and hammer to secure them in place when we sue them. I'm sure Rodney can insert a picture of them in here for all to see. So,,,, ALL JET JOCKEYS including ME, Please take a few moments to set these blast boards up the next time you bring your jet fuel burning pride and joy to RDRC. They not only will help save our grass, but will make startups safer for all. They will also help prevent us from blasting our co-members and guest with hot kero smelling exhaust. Dave put enough angle on them that all



blast will be diverted very nicely. Also, when we start our jets we need to use the small paved taxi aprons of the runway. We now have two of them to use. Place the blast board off to one side of the apron (depending on wind direction) towards the rear, and preferable away from the flight station. This will help eliminate having an obstacle for others to hit during not so good landings!!!! ;) Blast boards have become a regularly used tool at many jet events now for good reason. First in Flight now uses 8 of them, each being 8ft long! They have saved grass, flying debris, and made working under the admin tent a WHOLE lot better. Just ask Clyde and Marshall!!!! So there you have it guys. Another great project from Dave Hockenberry. Let's please take the time to use them. And when you're done for the day, please place them back in the shed.

Now on to something else very important. All of you remember I had Rodney send out a letter from me in regards to flying over farmers, through sprinklers and other activities in our club. Thankfully there have been no phone calls from land owners the last couple of weeks, but I did get a call from one of our members who was talking to Robert Richards. This member plans to share those comments from Robert at this month's meeting. Without going into too much detail I just wanted to share this. First, we must avoid flying over any people as much as possible. It's not just a club thing, but an AMA issue as well. It's farming season folks. These guys need to make a living. We're playing, they are trying to put food on their table and pay the bills. Let's not make that harder for them. I have contacted two other clubs in our area asking if they deal with any issues like us. In BOTH cases they said yes and bottom line was, they let all their members know the farmers have right of way. In fact, one of the clubs RAMS makes a point to bring this to member's attention during the farming season. Keep in mind folks, the season is short for the farmer next door. This year he's producing cucumbers. That's a short season crop. Also, with all the rain we are having this year, he needs to take advantage of every opportunity he has to get in and out of those fields. Some of you saw how muddy and soft those fields get when we had our storms recently. You couldn't even walk across the rows without sinking several inches. So guys, let's just make the effort to help these guys out.

Also something we need to address. NOISE. One of the complaints were getting from neighbors is noise. Particularly with the larger models. For the most part I think the majority of our members try to keep their models on the quiet side, but we do have a few that are ripping the prop or use minimal exhaust systems. Although we have not implemented any detailed sound limits on our members and do not want to, we do ask our members to make every reasonable effort to keep the noise down. Other clubs DO require models to be under a certain DB limit or require canister mufflers. Hopefully we will not ever have to go down that road, but the only way to avoid such actions is do a good job with our models now. So please, try to keep your model as quiet as you can. Use the right prop. Or if you have canisters now, install them. I realize they cost quite a bit more, but its low compared to the alternative. Contrary to what some modelers think,. The use of canisters actually improves performance of the gas engines. When properly set up it improves the scavenging effect our two stroke engines operate on. It's a fact,...,, Look It Up!! Nuff said???? Let's try to keep the noise to an acceptable limit boys! J

And lastly. Fly for Tots is getting really close folks. Planning and preparations are already well underway. I'll be calling on several folks to help as in years past, especially with donation recruitments and services. In an effort to make set up easier this year I have opted to rent the 20X30 tents from the tent vendor I have dealt with for several years now. He made me a great offer and took into consideration this was a charity event. He's letting me have two 20X40 tents for under \$400. He will transport, erect and tear down everything for that price. This leaves our crew a lot more time to focus on other areas like the parking area, barrels, flags and signage. Of course this is all pending out ability to get the shelter improvements done prior to FFT. With the difficulty in getting bids, and the fact it's hotter that #@#\$ outside, I was looking at what would make the work load easier on our workers. I'm more than willing to put up the money myself to make this happen. We can discuss further at the club meeting. But good news is, no running down tents. No fighting the poles, and no storm damage repairs to make in case we get weather like years past.

WE NEED CANDY DROPPERS!!!!!! If you have a big bird capable of hauling candy, or have one already equipped to do so please let me know. The Noon Time candy drop has always been a huge success with the public, especially the kids! Let's carry on the tradition in a big way! Get that plane ready Alex, and get in some practice ;)

That's it for now. We'll talk more at the meeting this month. Hope you all can make the trip. I want to finish with one final note. Some of you may be aware but for those who do not. As a result of our club safety officer needing to resign, I was faced with having to appoint a new one. Terry Jackson has offered to hold the position and I would like to thank him for doing so. Terry is a long time member of RDRC and well aware of the daily operations we have. Terry is eager to see RDRC continue its efforts to make RDRC the safest club in our district, and safe for all of our members. Please take a moment to thank him when you see him at the meeting or the field. More importantly, please support him in his job as safety officer and make his job an easier one by being a safe club member yourself.



RDRC CLUB MINUTES, June 28, 2016

President Larry Lewis called the meeting to order at 6:35 PM on June 28, 2016 in the Forks Restaurant in Wake Forest. All club officers were present except IT Officer Steve Ballard. Welcoming remarks were made and meeting agenda was presented. There were 18 members and 2 visitors present. The guests, Mac McFerrin and Steve Izzo were voted in at the meeting. Larry Reported on his conversations with other clubs about Associate memberships. Most clubs have eliminated Associate memberships.

Treasurer's report: Clyde Long reported that the club had \$18,703.09 in our account with all bills paid through May.

Safety Officers Report: Larry Lewis said he had received several phone calls relative to members flying over farm workers and flying through the spray from the farmer's irrigation system. Clark McKeever reported that the farmer was upset and the workers were afraid for their safety. He has talked with the farmer about the actions of our club members and tried to assure the farmer that we would take care of the situation. He indicated that everything is probably OK if things are not repeated. Please take off and land away from the workers.

Secretary's Report: Marshall Sanderson presented the May minutes and a motion by Dave Lanridge and a second by Don King to accept the May meeting minutes as posted was passed.

IT Communications Officer's Report: No report as Steve Ballard was not present.

Field Marshal's Report: John Keisler reported that crack filler test was good and sealer will be applied over the cracks on Wednesday, July 6. John and Don King gave the committee report about bushes for the flight stations. Option 1 would be the bushes and cost would be about \$1600.00. Option 2 is to refurb and repaint the existing flight stations. Dave Hockenbury has repaired the existing stations and they are ready to prep and paint. Ed Radiel donated paint and Judy Radiel offered to paint the stands. To upgrade existing stands with vinyl wrap and vinyl horizontal 2 X 4s would cost about \$400.00. The committee recommended painting now and revisiting the issue next spring. The recommendation to paint was accepted. Moving the fences near the electrical stations will happen sometime soon.

Old Business: Larry Lewis talked about replacing and expanding the current roof. A motion to have Larry get one or more bids for the work was made by Mark Lofgren and seconded by Dave Langridge. The motion passed. Larry said he and Josh Bunn would look into the issue.

New Business: Election of officers nominated at the May meeting was held and the following slate of officers were Elected.

Someone headed up a painting activity and got the flight stations painted over the weekend. Ed Radial I think was one that was involved with this.




We had 6 people that braved the hot morning heat on July 6th to fill the cracks in the Runway.

dered from Tower Hobbies. Phoenix makes a well built plane of Balsa and ply for the money and I plan to build a corsair as soon as they're in. The ARF was listed for \$159.99 but after all Tower's discounts paid \$115.00 for it. No Tax and free shipping from Tower was a added plus.






For power I used a OS Max 55 AX that fit nicely in the cowl inverted. The manual called to use the stock muffler out the left side. I wanted to keep it as original looking as possible, so I ordered a in cowl muffler from J-Tec. I received it and found it to hit the front of the cowl where it curves around to the spinner. With the decision of having to cut the cowl again and loose the look I was looking for, I left the cowl alone and cut the muffler to clear the inside of the cowl. With a hack saw and

hand file I cut the corner off and made a new piece for it and had it Tig welded in so it all fit under the hood.

They give the option to do gas or electric and put a nice little hatch in the to front for a battery. Since I went with gas, I decided to mount the receiver switch and charge jack in this location to keep it out of site.



It come with a yellow spinner that just didn't look right on this. So I got a Dave Brown spinner to finish it off. The rest of the plane I built by the manual. I used Tactic servos for controls and one Hitec retract servo for the set of mechanical retracts that comes with the mustang. Hope to maiden it this week some time once the heat

calms down.
