Next event is Fly-For-Tots.

New Business: After some discussion about possible new barriers for flight stations a motion was made by Don King and seconded by John Keisler to investigate hedge. Motion passed. Don and John will investigate hedges for flight stations.

A motion was made by Don King and seconded by Dave Langridge to investigate new options for shed and shelter. Motion passed.

A motion was made by John Keisler and seconded by Dave Langridge to temporarily disable breakers to outlets on shelves of the shed for charging safety. Motion passed. They will investigate a more permanent solution.

The May meeting was moved to May 17 and nominations for new officers will be made at the May meeting.

There being no new business a motion to adjourn was made and passed. The meeting adjourned at 8:05 PM.
