# **Training Column- Chargers and Power Supplies**

In last month's training column, we discussed LIPo batteries. I thought the logical next step would be to discuss battery chargers and power supplies.

I have been using the <u>ICharger 106B+</u> for some time now and have been completely happy with it. I can't think of anything negative to say about it. On the other hand, the power supply I have been using is a different story. It is an ElectricFly 12V 12 Amp power supply. For today's standards, 12 V 12 amp is on the modest side. But the thing that annoyed me was the noisy cooling fan caused by vibration of the fan with the power supply case.

I recently bought another power supply and you can tell it is better made than the ElectricFly. It is a <u>Junsi P350</u> with an output of 15V and 23 amps. Junsi are the same folks that make IChargers. I'm optimistic that I will be happy with this power supply. The one negative I have to say about it is the bottom of the unit was just bare metal- no "rubber feet". That was easily remedy by applying 4 self-adhesive rubber "dots" that I picked up from Ace Hardware.

For those who fly fuel airplanes, I can't recommend enough the charger I use for the lead acid starter battery. It is called **Battery Tender Plus**. It charges your battery at a very low rate so you won't risk cooking the battery. Many people who have collector cars that are not driven much keep a battery tender running on the battery 24 hours/7 days a week.

So now I ask you: What brand of battery chargers and power supplies do you use? Do you have a recommendation on a good place to buy them? Any other words of wisdom on the subject that you would like to share with your fellow club members?
